

P) Proposal Details

P.1) This is a proposal for:

Modification of an existing undergraduate or graduate program, degree, minor, or certificate

P.2) Proposal Summary

The history department would like to add an additional option to the major, one that integrates hula and Hawaiian language components to the study of Hawaiian history at UH-Hilo, providing a more indigenous approach to the study of the history of Hawai'i as a whole, and to prepare future historians of Hawai'i who are prepared to meet the expectations of community and academia. Students who choose this option will be asked to incorporate an additional 21.0 credits of Hawaiian Studies, as well as 32.0 credits of Hawaiian Language courses to their overall plan. Students will be advised in their course selection so as to meet GE and other graduation requirements through careful selection of courses that also meet the requirements of this option.

P.3) Proposal Rationale/Justification

More and more, those who graduate with a bachelor's degree in Hawaiian history are expected to have Hawaiian language skills previously expected at the graduate level. To be accepted into top graduate programs, prospective students are now expected to have basic translation skills in 'Ōlelo Hawai'i. In order to further encourage our students to pursue both Hawaiian history and 'Ōlelo Hawai'i, we want to develop an integrated Hawaiian History option that will assist them in reaching the goal of excelling at both. Our community is also expecting more from graduates with a Hawaiian history degree. With expectations for consultation, along with the recognition of the place of performance in "traditional" expressions and maintaining of Hawaiian history, we want to develop future historians of Hawai'i who can fully contribute to our community by developing a skillset and recognition of the layers and complexities of "doing" Hawaiian history. The Integrated Hawaiian History Option at UH-Hilo will provide a unique opportunity for our students to increase their capacity and potential in academia as well as fulfill a significant role in our community as they are encouraged to bring together the skills set forth within the disciplines of historical study, 'Ōlelo Hawai'i, and Hula.

This program option will lead to increased service-learning opportunities within our program; increase public history training and opportunities for our students; provide preparation for work force, graduate school, and teaching opportunities, as well as contributions to our communities; meets objectives of Papa O Ke Ao; addresses graduation initiatives, specifically working to increase Native Hawaiian graduation rates; and will create a pathway from HawCC to UH-Hilo within the study of History. In terms of impact on other programs at UH-Hilo, we do not expect there to be an immediate impact felt, but over time it will likely add to increased enrollments in Ka Haka 'Ula O Ke'elikōlani, Hawaiian Language courses in particular.
