- Attained a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.50 on work completed at UH Hilo (transfer students meeting other requirements may be provisionally admitted during their first semester at UH Hilo, but will be required to earn at least a 2.5 GPA on their first 12 credits at UH Hilo for continued enrollment in upper division business courses)
- Successfully completed all course specific prerequisites
