## P.3) Proposal Rationale/Justification

The 50 percent rule is no longer part of AACSB requirements, so we can remove it.

The BBA Concentration in Professional Studies allows flexibility in the electives portion of the BBA and answers a demand from programs such as the A.S. in IS at HCC to construct a pathway to the BBA.

The rest of the modifications make explicit policies that we have routinely been approving through waivers.

## P.6) Proposal Impact(s) - Resources

No additional resources are required. These proposals will save time as they will eliminate the need for multiple waivers and manual entry of the BUA code on the part of the dean's office.

The addition of MGT 425 as an alternative to BUS 110/100 was designed for transfer students, who routinely objected to having to take BUS 110 or BUS 100 after they were already doing upper-division coursework. These students were routinely allowed to substitute an upper-division elective for this requirement, which required a manual waiver. Because around half of our students are transfers, this resulted in a large number of waivers.

The University also places several graduation requirements on all baccalaureate degree programs, and these must be satisfied by candidates for the BBA (Please see the Baccalaureate Degree Requirements.)
