

P.2) Proposal Summary

A new academic subject certificate in Hawaiian and Indigenous Language Medium Early Education within the existing BOR approved Hawaiian Studies Baccalaureate Program of Ka Haka 'Ula O Ke'elikolani, College of Hawaiian Language. No changes to the existing programs of the College will occur aside from offering an additional option for students to obtain a certificate in Hawaiian and Indigenous Language Early Education.

P.3) Proposal Rationale/Justification

The proposed new certificate in Hawaiian and Indigenous Language Medium Early Education will benefit students by providing an additional option to gain a certificate at the University of Hawaii- Hilo. It will provide students interested in Hawaiian education, Hawaiian medium education, and Hawaiian medium early education a dedicated pathway to focus on this area of study. This certificate is especially relevant to students preparing to become early childhood educators as it provides foundational mauli ola education coursework. It is anticipated that many students will matriculate into the college's Kahuawaiola Indigenous teacher Education program where they will be prepared for teacher licensure. The provision of a non-Hawaiian Indigenous language medium pathway to the certificate is designed to address the legislated mission of the College to provide outreach to other indigenous peoples who are increasingly drawn to the College.

No other program in the University of Hawai'i system nor academia as a whole globally, offers a certificate in early education through the medium of Hawaiian itself and from an Indigenous perspective. The added certificate will benefit the University as it provides curriculum and discourse from an Indigenous perspective and world view and exemplifies the global and diverse nature of the academy at Hilo. Additionally, the program will address the need of the State of Hawai'i to provide a pathway to increase the number of highly qualified Hawaiian and Indigenous medium early childhood educators.

1.1) Degree Type

1.2) Program Description

The Certificate in Hawaiian and Indigenous Language Medium Early Education is intended to provide students with the basic foundation of Hawaiian and Indigenous early education through the medium of Hawaiian and Indigenous Language itself examining: (1) Hawaiian and Indigenous perspective, philosophy, theories, methodology, and resources in early education and (2) Hawaiian and Indigenous medium early education as part of their undergraduate studies. Core courses in this certificate provide students with foundations in Hawaiian or Indigenous language as it relates to education, the history and background of the Hawaiian language movement and the Pūnana Leo Hawaiian Medium educational institution, Pūnana Leo early education methodology and curriculum and other educational foundations that affect Hawaiian and Indigenous early education, child development, and teacher responsibilities in Hawaiian and Indigenous medium and Hawaiian immersion settings. Elective courses in this certificate provide supplemental Hawaiian language and Hawaiian culture knowledge applicable to Hawaiian early education and Hawaiian medium early education. Students may select an elective course from a variety of Hawaiian language and/or Hawaiian culture related courses. The non-Hawaiian Indigenous Language Medium track is designed to be a mirror image of the Hawaiian track available for outreach to other indigenous peoples seeking support from the College, parrallel to efforts currently occurring at the graduate and undergraduate levels.

Students who graduate with a Certificate in Hawaiian and Indigenous Medium Early Education will be prepared with the knowledge to work at a Pūnana Leo preschool or a Hawaiian Early Education institution or parrallel indigenous language medium preschool. *The certificate does not culminate in eligibility for a teaching license.*

Students pursuing this certificate will complete 18-19 credit hours. Students must receive a grade of "C" or better in all courses applied to this certificate program.
