No specific pre-law program or major is required for admission to law school; however, many pre-law students major in Philosophy, Economics, History, Anthropology, Sociology, Geography, Business, English, Political Science, or the Administration of Justice. Whatever the major, students intending to apply to law school will benefit from courses emphasizing critical analysis, writing, and analytical/methodological frameworks of interpretation. 3. How does the NEW program or program modification benefit students, the curriculum, and the institution, and how does this change relate to or impact other programs at the university?

According to the American Bar Association's Statement on Pre-Law Preparation, students wishing to pursue legal education should "take advantage of opportunities to develop research and writing skills" in order to develop a lawyering skill set. Through rigorous engagement in a variety of subject areas taught by demanding instructors, such lawyering skills include "problem solving, critical reading, writing and editing, oral communication and listening, research, organization and management, public service and promotion of justice, relationship-building and collaboration, background knowledge, and exposure to the law." This interdisciplinary certificate has been developed to provide students, particularly transfer students, with a wide array of upper division electives across a variety of majors. For students wishing to remain in Hawai'i and focus upon Native Hawaiian as well as environmental issues (two foci of Richardson's Law School at UH Manoa), such classes are available in the certificate's thematic-based course groupings of Rights and Disparities, Land Use and Cultural Resources, and Skills and Professional Expertise.

Additionally, this certificate contributes to several goals of the 2011-2015 UH Hilo Strategic Plan. With a focus on classes that emphasize research and writing skills, this certificate will help support the applications of UH Hilo students to law school within Hawai'i and elsewhere, in accordance with Goal 1 *Provide learning experiences and support to prepare students to thrive, compete, innovate and lead in their professional and personal lives*. Since 2010, an average of twelve UHH students have applied each year to William S. Richardson School of Law at UH Manoa with an admittance average of only four students [*Source: Elisabeth Steele Hutchison (Director of Admissions at Richardson's Law School)*]. In accordance with Goal 5 *Strengthen UH Hilo's impact on the community, Island, and state of Hawai'i through responsive higher education, community partnerships, and knowledge and technology transfer*, this certificate is expected to increase rates of UH Hilo applicants and admittance rates to Hawaii's local law school, Richardson's, by preparing students to succeed in the law school environment while fostering the articulation possibilities between our campus and Hawai'i Community College. Lastly, this certificate will serve a variety of students with majors and minors through a varied elective pool of interdisciplinary offerings from CAS (the Social Sciences and Humanities divisions) and CoBE. In doing so, this certificate encourages faculty collaboration among participating departments, in response to Goal 2 *Inspire excellence in teaching, research, and collaboration*. Lastly, through interdisciplinary collaboration, this certificate is one way to achieve the 2020 Vision of UH Hilo (as stated in the Strategic Plan), which states "We will be acclaimed as a university community that works together across disciplines and diverse perspectives to prepare student scholars to thrive, compete, innovate and lead in their professional and personal lives."

At some point it would be helpful to see the program requirements. Also, since especially BUS 240 is currently offered in only one section per semester and is often full, it would be helpful to get an idea of potential demand for these two classes from Pre-Law students.
