SUBJECT: Approval of Combined B.A./M.A. Pathways in the Department of East Asian

Languages & Literatures (EALL)

#### **SPECIFIC ACTION REQUESTED:**

It is requested that the combined B.A./M.A. pathways for the following concentrations be created in the Department of East Asian Languages & Literatures:

- Chinese Language & Linguistics CHN-BA(13)
- Chinese Literature
- Japanese Language & Linguistics JPN-BA(13)
- Japanese Literature
- Korean Language & Linguistics KOR-BA(13)
- Korean Literature
- Korean for Professionals

Fall 2024

#### PURPOSE AND BACKGROUND:

The Department of EALL offers three B.A. degrees in Chinese, Japanese, and Korean (CJK), including the Flagship tracks in Chinese and Korean, an M.A., and a PhD degree. The EALL M.A. program is comprised of seven concentrations: Chinese Language & Linguistics, Chinese Literature, Japanese Language & Linguistics, Japanese Literature, Korean Language & Linguistics, Korean Literature, and Korean for Professionals.

At the graduate level, each of the three language sections (Chinese, Japanese, and Korean) has two different disciplines (Language/Linguistics and Literature), which accounts for six of the seven aforementioned concentrations within the M.A. program. The seventh concentration is *Korean for Professionals*, which was created when the federally-funded Korean Flagship Language Center launched in 2002 at UHM. Each concentration has its own specific program objectives and requirements (for details, see the attached EALL MA concentration requirements).

During the last six fiscal years (FY18-FY23), 56 EALL M.A. degrees were conferred, which was 9.3 degrees per year. Those recent EALL M.A. graduates typically went on to careers in government agencies, continued in our Ph.D. program, or found teaching positions in K-12 schools or higher education institutions.

The purpose of this memo is to propose a B.A./M.A. pathway for each of the seven concentrations within the M.A. program. The table below summarizes the proposed gateway courses and double-counted courses for the seven concentrations.

#### **JUSTIFICATION:**

Need for the B.A./M.A. pathways: When advising CJK undergraduates, EALL faculty often find that motivated students choose to continue in our M.A. program upon completing their respective B.A. studies. Some of these undergraduates have even enrolled in a few EALL graduate courses as electives to fulfill their B.A. requirements. For these reasons, the EALL graduate faculty hope to set up the combined B.A./M.A. Pathways for these highly motivated students to efficiently complete their Bachelor's degree and Master's degree in a shorter time frame. We have had full discussions within each section, and have carefully examined the B.A. requirements and their corresponding M.A. requirements.

Gateway and double-counted courses: The identified gateway courses and double-counted courses are well articulated to each other as the gateway (undergraduate) courses are mostly prerequisites of the double-counted graduate courses. More than three courses are identified as double-counted courses for the Chinese and Japanese concentrations to allow some flexibility in meeting the requirement. We hope to require different minimum grades for the gateway courses, depending on whether they are language or non-language ("content or survey") courses. The gateway courses with an "A-" as the minimum grade to enter the BAM track are *language* courses since we expect the candidates to move to the next level with higher language proficiency. The gateway courses with a "B" as the minimum grade to enter the BAM track are *non-language* courses.

Admission and advising: Each B.A./M.A. pathway in EALL anticipates that a student will apply to the master's program during the second semester of their junior year. To be eligible to apply for the program, the student must first pass the gateway course within the minimum required grade as specified for concentration to be pursued for the M.A. degree. If a student is accepted into a B.A./M.A. pathway in EALL, they must meet with both the Undergraduate Advisor and the Graduate Chair to discuss their pathway plan before registering for the three double-counted courses to be taken during their senior year. If a student fails to maintain a GPA of 3.0 or better after admission into the B.A./M.A. pathway, they will be removed from the MA degree-granting portion of the program and allowed to graduate with a BA degree upon completion of the BA requirements.

- Japanese Linguistics MA students are required to take four 600-level graduate courses in Japanese linguistics.
- They must include Japanese syntax/semantics (JPN 602), Japanese language pedagogy (JPN 604), and Japanese sociolinguistics (JPN 606).
- The fourth course may be any of the following: JPN 605, 632, 633, 634 or 650-alpha.

#### Literature Course (3 credits)

• Japanese Linguistics MA students are also required to take one graduate-level (600-level) Japanese literature course. Please note that at least one graduate-level Japanese literature course is offered every semester, but the course usually alternates between a modern Japanese literature course and a pre-modern literature course. In order to enroll in pre-modern Japanese literature courses, students need to be familiar with Pre-modern Japanese. If students have no previous exposure to Pre-modern Japanese, and they wish to take a pre-modern Japanese literature course, they are recommended to first take JPN 461 (Introduction to Classical Japanese), which is offered every Fall semester.




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#### Elective Courses (6 to 12 credits)

- Students can use any of the 600/700-level JPN linguistics courses (e.g., JPN 605, 632, 633, 634, 650-alpha, and 730-alpha) as elective courses
- Any 600/700-level courses that the academic advisor pre-approves can count as elective courses as well.
- Only up to 6 credits of elective courses may come from 400-level courses with the academic advisor's approval.
- Only up to 3 credits of JPN 699 can count as elective credits

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## Required/suggested courses for Japanese Literature MA

#### Core Courses (12 credits)

Japanese Literature MA students are required to take at least four graduate courses in Japanese literature at the 600 level or above. Usually, one Japanese literature graduate course is offered each semester: one on modern literature in the fall semester, and one on pre-modern Japanese literature during the spring semester. Students are expected to take a balance of both modern and pre-modern literature courses regardless of individual research area, in consultation with their academic advisor. All students are strongly recommended to first take JPN 461 (Introduction to Classical Japanese), which is usually offered every Fall semester, before enrolling in pre-modern Japanese literature courses.

#### Linguistic Course (3 credits)

 Japanese Literature MA students are also required to take a minimum of one graduate-level (600-level) Japanese linguistics course. This course may be chosen from the following areas in consultation with the advisor: Japanese phonology/morphology (JPN 601), Japanese syntax/semantics (JPN 602), Japanese language pedagogy (JPN 604) and Japanese sociolinguistics (JPN 606).

#### Seminar Course (3 credits)


• The seminar course requirement can be satisfied with CHN 753, JPN 710, KOR 720 or their equivalent. With the academic advisor's approval, students may use another

600 or 700-level seminar course to satisfy this requirement.

Elective Courses (6 to 12 credits)

 Students can use any of the 600-level JPN literature courses as elective courses. In addition to CHN or KOR graduate-level literature courses, with the advisor's approval elective courses may include courses offered outside of EALL. A maximum of two 400-level courses will count toward the degree. Only up to 3 credits of JPN 699 can count as elective credits

## Korean Flagship: M.A. in Korean for Professionals

#### **Degree Requirements**

The Students in Korean Flagship MA program are subject to Master's Plan B degree requirements. For the fulfillment of Master's Plan B degree requirements, students must complete a minimum of 30 credits, while taking at least 21 credits from courses numbered 600 or above. The details of the Master's Plan B degree requirements are provided below.

Total Credit Requirements	A minimum of 30 credits is required. Except as noted, courses taken under the Credit/No-Credit option will not be applied toward the requirements for the master's degree.
Credits for Courses numbered 600 or above (excluding 699)	A minimum of 24 credits is required.
Research seminar course (700)	A minimum of 3 credits is required
Credits for 699	Maximum 3 credits from directed reading/research (699) may be applied toward degree requirements.
Culminating Experience	A Capstone paper
