PURPOSE:

The proposed Graduate Certificate in Program Evaluation is designed to equip graduate students and working professionals with expertise to in research offices in higher education.

BACKGROUND:

UH Executive Policy E5.205 grants the Chancellor the authority to approve certificate programs in specific subjects that represent the recognition of work taken within (or among) existing Board-authorized programs.

The proposed Graduate Certificate in Program Evaluation is designed for graduate students across campus and working professionals who wish to upgrade their knowledge and skills in the theory, design and practice of program evaluation. The 15 credits required for the program are comprised of courses taught regularly by faculty in the Department of Educational Psychology and across the College of Education. No new resources are required for the program.

PURPOSE: The Certificate in Program Evaluation (PE) in the Department of Educational Psychology addresses a need to develop documented expertise in program evaluation for masters and doctoral students across the Manoa campus, as well as professionals who are working in these areas in the community. Students who demonstrate their proficiency through the Program Evaluation certificate's curriculum, will be able to serve in research units and in higher education offices that require expertise in program evaluation. The PE certificate courses are currently taught in the Department of Educational Psychology or in the College of Education, and the certificate will complement the MEd and PhD programs already being offered.

WHEREAS, the purpose of a Graduate Certificate in Program Evaluation in Educational Psychology in the College of Education (COE) is to develop expertise for Masters and Ph.D. students as well as working professionals serving the community to serve as a resource for assessment and evaluation of educational and research programs; and

WHEREAS, program evaluation is a growing field that is not currently served by the University of Hawai'i System; and

WHEREAS, no new resources are required for the certificate as existing courses from the Dept. of Educational Psychology have been offered for decades and existing faculty will create two new courses to complete the certificate; and

WHEREAS, the certificate is intended for existing graduate students to expand their expertise with program evaluation and students in Psychology are required to complete a graduate certificate; and

WHEREAS, the Dept. of Educational Psychology facilitates the UH Strategic Directions by serving the Hawaiian community preparing educational researchers and evaluators that work in the Dept. of Education, other Universities, and businesses; and

WHEREAS, the certificate has been reviewed and endorsed by the Department of Educational Psychology, the COE Dean, the COE Committee for Curricular and Program Planning, the COE Senate, the Office of Graduate Education, the Graduate Council, and the Chancellor; therefore

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Mānoa Faculty Senate approves the proposal to establish a Graduate Certificate in Program Evaluation in Educational Psychology in the College of Education (COE).

The code EPPE is available. Will use this code for your program,

For the program length, we are required to provide the length of time a student should take if they are attending full time. We report students based on the enrollment status such as full time, three quarter time, half time and less than half time. This information is considered when trying to determine if a student completed their degree in a timely manner. Based on the information you have provided, 30 weeks should be appropriate.

Our faculty likes the code EPPE for the program evaluation certificate. Does that work?

I'm still not clear regarding the implications of the length of the program. If students take longer than 30 weeks, are they considered at fault because they didn't finish in time? Most students will do this program part time, and will take longer than 30 weeks. If there are no particular negative implications for students or for our program, 30 weeks for the program length is fine. If students will be penalized or the department will be penalized if students take longer than 30 weeks, we should make it 45 weeks.
