## PURPOSE:

The purpose of the request to amend the degree titles of Bachelor of Arts in French, Bachelor of Arts in German, and Bachelor of Arts in Spanish is to create one single, consolidated degree (Bachelor of Arts in Languages \& Literatures of Europe \& the Americas), with three tracks (French Studies, German Studies, and Spanish \& Latin American Studies).

## BACKGROUND:

The background to this request is prompted by the revised recommendations of the Mānoa Budget Team (October 13, 2020: "Consider merging undergraduate programs under a single BA with concentrations (which could serve as a home for the German program)." LLEA has taken the 'revised recommendations' as a mandate to merge the lower-enrolled German with the French and Spanish BA programs to create a single BA. LLEA has submitted a program modification memo to consolidate the three BAs in German, French and Spanish into one BA: (Bachelor of Arts in Languages \& Literatures of Europe \& the Americas), with three tracks (French Studies, German Studies and Spanish \& Latin American Studies).

LLEA has informed KCC, LCC, WCC, HCC, Kauai CC, Maui CC, and UH Hill of the consolidation of its BA. We have written to department chairs and, in two cases the appropriate deans, to inform them that although LLEA will now have one BA with three tracks, this change will not mean any disruption to their own French, German or Spanish programs or courses given that the pre-requisite to enter the BA in either of the three tracks continues to be at the 202-level.

Students admitted in Fall 2022 will be enrolled under the new degree title "Bachelor of Arts in Languages \& Literature of Europe \& the Americas" and opt into one of the three aforementioned tracks. Once all students who remain in the stopped-out degree names have graduated, the department will submit requests to terminate the old program names.

## SPECIFIC ACTION REQUESTED:

It is requested that the Interim Vice Provost for Academic Excellence approve the proposed changes to consolidate the French, German and Spanish BA degrees in the Department of Languages \& Literatures of Europe \& the Americas (LLEA) into one single BA degree, with three tracks: French Studies, German Studies, and Spanish \& Latin American Studies.

## REQUESTED EFFECTIVE TERM:

Fall 2022.

## ADDITIONAL COST:

None.

## RATIONALE/PURPOSE OF PROPOSED CHANGE(S):

Currently, the Department of Languages \& Literatures of Europe \& the Americas offers four BA degree programs: Classics, German, French and Spanish. Classics will leave LLEA and move to the Department of Religions \& Ancient Civilizations, a new department, upon the President's approval ${ }^{1}$. The remaining three BA degree programs -French, German and Spanish- will merge into a single BA degree program.

This proposal includes the modification of the curricula to unify the Department's offerings while supporting each of the three remaining areas of study: French, German and Spanish.

This request is prompted by the revised recommendations of the Mānoa Budget Team (October 13, 2020:
"Consider merging undergraduate programs under a single BA with concentrations (which could serve as a home for the German program)." Given the original recommendations of "Stop-out the BA in German" and "[d]evelop combined degree pathways for...French and Spanish (Education)," we have taken the 'revised recommendations' as a mandate to merge the lower-enrolled German with the French and Spanish BA programs to create a single BA.

[^0]We believe that this new consolidated BA will strengthen our programs, and will, in fact, make the new BA more robust. Expanding the focus of this new BA to create a greater number of interdisciplinary and cross-cultural connections while devising a more flexible curriculum, we believe, will appeal to a wider audience, broaden students' perspectives and allow them to finish in a more timely fashion. While LLEA has always been cognizant of our situation in the Pacific and our relationships with other Pacific nations, namely in the Americas, the department has been especially mindful of UHM's Prioritization Document (3/16/21) \#1, regarding UHM as a Native Hawaiian Place of Learning. This single BA will have a core component to all three tracks which promotes Hawai'i as a Native Place of Learning, and posits cross-cultural connections and interdisciplinarity as key tenants guiding the new degree.

To achieve a more streamlined and more coherent degree, the language programs have revamped courses by changing their names, retiring others and creating new courses that more closely adhere to our guiding principles as mentioned above.

We are aware that there has been some concern regarding the use of credits without a letter grade toward the major requirements in LLEA, which are based on national exams such as AP and IB, or CBE (Credits by Exam) for experiential learning. Although we do not believe this issue to be related to the consolidation of degrees requested by the MBT, we would like to take the opportunity to explain our rationale. In 2014, EALL, IPLL, and LLEA were asked by the UHM administration to realign the credits students received for AP and IB exams because it was believed that a good $75 \%$ of local high-school students were not applying to UHM due to the university's more "restrictive policies" in this regard. A result of this request was to bolster the number of credits LLEA offered for AP and IB exams. (According to LLEA's policy, students may receive a maximum of 6 credits, although most students who apply only receive 3 credits.) A quick inquiry this month into a few peer institutions, such as the U. of Mississippi, the U. of Kentucky, the U. of Arizona, and the U. of Illinois at Chicago, reveals that the last three offer credits for AP or IB exams, for example in their Spanish programs. At the U. of Arizona and the U. of Illinois at Chicago, students of Spanish can earn up to 6 credits to use in their majors.

Besides the application of credits for AP and IB institutional learning, LLEA recognizes and strongly supports experiential learning, especially that of a language. Many of our underserved students do not have the opportunity to take AP or IB exams in their high schools but have nevertheless attained the same proficiency (or higher) through family and life experiences. We believe it to be discriminatory against minorities and national origin to not value experiential learning to the same degree that institutional learning is valued when the proficiency is the same. Therefore, we respectfully request that we be allowed to continue conferring heritage and native speakers who pass the rigorous and stringent CBE evaluations the same number of credits that students could attain via an AP or IB exam.

## DETAILED LIST OF CHANGE(S):

1. Proposed changes to tracks and curriculum (see attached program sheets for details)
A. Merge the BA in French, the BA in German and the BA in Spanish to create one BA (BA in Languages \& Literatures of Europe \& the Americas ${ }^{2}$ ) with three tracks: French Studies, German Studies and Spanish \& Latin American Studies. The proposed changes below are intended to unify requirements for the three new tracks.

[^1]B. Changes to the French BA: Create a French Studies track, reduce the French BA requirements from 33 credits to 27 credits, change the D - grade in prerequisite courses to continue in the major to a C grade, and require only one 400 -level course instead of two.
C. Changes to the German BA: Create a German Studies track, reduce the German BA requirements from 30 credits to 27 credits, change the C - grade in prerequisite courses to continue in the major to a C grade, and require one 400 -level course, when none was required.
D. Changes to the Spanish BA: Create a Spanish \& Latin American Studies track, reduce the Spanish BA requirements from 33 credits to 27 credits, continue with a C in prerequisite courses required to continue in the major, and require only one 400-level course instead of two.
E. Standardize the requirements for the three tracks into the same three areas: Core Course ( 3 credits), Required Course ( 3 credits) and Electives ( 21 credits). Neither Core courses nor Required courses may be double-dipped as Electives. If students do not place at least at the 300 -level in the language of their choice (French, German, Portuguese or Spanish), they must take an additional 3 to 12 credits in that language to reach the 300 -level.
i. Core course ( 3 cr ) Students pursuing the new BA in LLEA, regardless of the track for which they have opted, must take one of three courses to fulfill the Core Course requirement: LLEA 371 (Europeans in the Pacific), LLEA 364 (Survey of French Civilizations), or LAIS 340 (Chocolate Tales \& Culinary Cultures: Latin America to Hawai‘i). The Department has submitted LAIS 340 as a core course for F22 as a further option to cover the cross-cultural and interdisciplinary nature of the new BA and focus on Hawai'i.
ii. Required course ( 3 cr ) The 3 credits that make up the Required Courses section of each track is a 400 -level course. These are divided in the following manner:
a. French Studies: 3 credits from any FR 400-level course
b. German Studies: 3 credits from any 400-level GER course, or LLEA 415, 416, or 455
c. Spanish \& Latin American Studies: 3 credits from any $400-\mathrm{level}$ SPAN or LAIS course, or LLEA 455
iii. Electives ( 21 cr ) The Electives section is made up of 21 credits in the new BA.
a. French Studies: 21 credits from any FR 300 or 400-level course: two of FR 312, 331, 332, and may count up to two courses from LLEA 335, 336, 339, 364, 455, 470, 471
B/C, or HIST 445
b. German Studies: 21 credits from any 300 or 400-level GER course, or LLEA 247, 320, 340, 341, 342, 371, 415, 416, 455
c. Spanish \& Latin American Studies: 21 credits from any 300 or 400 -level SPAN or LAIS course, or LLEA 455
