

Request to amend the titles of the Bachelor of Arts (BA) and Bachelors of SUBJECT:

> Fine Arts (BFA) in the Department of Theatre and Dance; and, upon approval of degree name changes, stop-out in existing BA and BFA

Programs

SPECIFIC ACTION REQUESTED:

First, it is requested that "Bachelor of Arts in Dance" and "Bachelor of Arts in Theatre" be changed to "Bachelor of Arts in Theatre and Dance," with two tracks: "Dance" and "Theatre."

Second, it is requested that "Bachelor of Fine Arts in Dance" be changed to "Bachelor of Fine Arts in Theatre and Dance," with two concentrations: "Dance" and "Acting for Theatre, Screen and New Media."

Third, it is requested that, upon approval of the requested degree name changes, the associated new degree codes be created, and the existing BA and BFA programs in the Department be stopped out.

RECOMMENDED EFFECTIVE DATE: Fall 2023, with the understanding that changes in Banner and the University Catalog will be implemented in the next possible effective term.

ADDITIONAL COST:

There will be no additional cost for this action.

PURPOSE:

The requested amendment will more appropriately represent the Theatre and Dance programs in merged BA and BFA degrees simultaneously proposed via a separate degree modification request to Interim VPAE Laura Lyons.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

Pursuant to Board of Regents Policy 5-1 h(1), Instructional Programs, Naming of Programs, the President has the authority to approve changes in the functional names of academic programs and credentials that involve no significant change in program requirements.

We are currently proposing to consolidate the separate BA degrees in Theatre and Dance by merging them. Curricular changes related to this proposal are addressed in a separate action memo addressed to iVPAE Laura Lyons. These changes are part of an overall departmental effort to consolidate what are currently two separate graduate programs, one in Theatre and one in Dance. Many of our faculty teach both Theatre and Dance students, and many of our students do both creative and academic research in both areas. A name change for these undergraduate degrees would not only acknowledge this reality of a united department but would also encourage future interdisciplinary collaboration between Theatre and Dance students and faculty at undergraduate and graduate levels.

ACTION RECOMMENDED:

First, it is recommended that "Bachelor of Arts in Dance" and "Bachelor of Arts in Theatre" be changed to "Bachelor of Arts in Theatre and Dance," with two tracks: "Dance" and "Theatre."

Second, it is recommended that "Bachelor of Fine Arts in Dance" be changed to "Bachelor of Fine Arts in Theatre and Dance," with two concentrations: "Dance" and "Acting for Theatre, Screen and New Media."

Third, it is recommended that, upon approval of the requested degree name changes, the associated new degree codes be created, and the existing BA and BFA programs in the Department be stopped out.


Fall 2023, with the understanding that changes in the University Catalog will be implemented in the next possible effective term.

PURPOSE:

The purpose is to modify and consolidate the curricula in our Department of Theatre and Dance degree programs. The requested program modifications to our current degree requirements, program sheets, and 4-year plans support the changes in our merger and newly proposed BA in Theatre and Dance (Theatre Track, Dance Track) and BFA in Theatre and Dance (Acting for Theatre, Screen and New Media Track, Dance Track.) (See separate Memo for request to change degree titles). There are several reasons prompting the request for these changes:






<u>Program Modifications for Program Sheets, Program Plans, and Degree Requirements for the BA in Theatre and Dance:</u>

- 1. The revised recommendations of the Manoa Budget Team from October 13, 2020 for our department: "Continue discussions to consolidate degrees and tracks in Theatre and Dance." Given the original recommendations of the Manoa Budget Team from September 11, 2020 to stop-out all of our Dance degrees (retaining only the dance minor), we interpret the revised "recommendations" as a directive to implement the suggested changes to our curriculum and degree requirements, in addition to requesting new degree titles and consolidating the separate BA programs in Theatre and BA in Dance by merging them and renaming them BA in Theatre and Dance, and renaming our BFA in Dance to BFA in Theatre and Dance.
- 2. The requested curriculum and program modification changes are supported by the departmental *Action Plan* for our department developed in June 2020 by Theatre and Dance faculty, (http://manoa.hawaii.edu/liveonstage/tdap/) aiming to decolonize our curriculum and programming, center our department on Hawaiian culture, and more closely integrate Theatre and Dance: "We will implement changes at various levels of our department [...] We will work to become a more unified department and to better integrate T&D by expanding the courses we offer as well as their content, and by making courses available to both T&D students." We are striving to create programs that integrate and allow for a broad range of cultural perspectives and traditions, recentering on Hawai'i, and integrating theatre and dance more fully. This is most clearly reflected in new core courses in Hawaiian Performance and Hula for the BA and BFA in Theatre and Dance, and expanded options that more fully integrate Asia and Pacific dance as options for fulfilling Theatre and Dance track requirements.

With this modification proposal, we are fulfilling the Manoa Budget Team's mandate to consolidate our degree programs and further the mission of the department.


<u>Detailed List of Modifications and Change(s) for BA in Theatre and Dance:</u>

Summary: The curricula of the proposed merged BA in Theatre and Dance will have a common core, consisting of 7 credits, detailed below; the BA track in Theatre will be reduced by two credits so that both tracks in the BA in Theatre and Dance degree will be parallel, requiring only 40 credits (a 2 cr. reduction from the BA in Theatre, but no change for BA in Dance).





<u>Program Modifications for Program Sheets, Program Plans, and Degree Requirements for the</u> new BFA in Theatre and Dance:

- 1. The Strategic Plan 2015-2025 of the University of Hawai'i at Manoa, p. 19: "[T]here are currently four Native Hawaiian place of learning strategic focus areas [at UHM], including: Native Hawaiian student success; Native and Hawaiian staff and faculty development, and support for all staff and faculty to engender a campus environment that embraces aloha 'aina; Cultivating a Native Hawaiian Environment; Native Hawaiian Community Engagement." It may seem to go against the intention of the Manoa Budget Team's revised recommendations that we are proposing the addition of a new BFA track in Acting for Theatre, Screen and New Media, but we are committed to strengthening ties with the developing film and TV work happening on the islands. The BFA in Theatre and Dance-Acting track will prepare students by training them in Indigenous Hawaiian and Asian performance idioms that they cannot obtain at other institutions. This is the best place for Hawai'is students to train.
- 2. The addition of the BFA track in Acting for Theatre, Screen and New Media is also closely tied to the department's restructuring and recentering of its curriculum to realize the vision of becoming a Native Hawaiian place of learning outlined in the *Action Plan* for the Theatre and Dance that the faculty developed in June 2020 (http://manoa.hawaii.edu/liveonstage/tdap/). This plan calls for our department to decolonize our curriculum and programming, center our department on Hawaiian culture, and more closely integrate Theatre and Dance: "We will implement changes at various levels of our department [...] We will work to become a more unified department and to better integrate T&D by expanding the courses we offer as well as their content, and by making courses available to both T&D students." We are striving to create programs that integrate and allow for a broad range of cultural perspectives and traditions, recentering on Hawai'i, and integrating theatre and dance more fully. This is clearly reflected in not only the new core BFA in Theatre and Dance degree courses, but in the aims of the BFA in Acting for Theatre, Screen and New Media track.


- 3. The addition of a BFA track in Acting for Theatre, Screen and New Media assures a balance enabling students to choose either a dance or theatre track in the BA or BFA program. The specific focus of this new track meets the needs of a developing industry in Hawai'i, creates more potential for working more closely with the Academy for Creative Media, and would provide the trained talent necessary to fulfill the production requirements for Theatre, Television, Film, and New Media productions. Furthermore, this track will assure that UHM:
 - a. remains competitive with peer institutions
 - b. provide training and education for students to move directly into the workforce in Hawai'i, the continental United States, and globally.
 - c. provides local actors for national and global productions in Film, Television, New Media, and Voice Acting for digital gaming and animation *without leaving Hawai'i*. Current casting on Oahu includes that for two national television shows and major film through national and international studios (eg. Rampage, Jurassic Park, voiceover for animation). Furthermore, local film production houses (eg. TalkStory Productions, Island Film Group) are vibrant and the industry posed to grow.
 - d. responds to an often-heard plea from top casting directors in Hawai'i for more trained actors for professional roles in Hawai'i's film and television industry. A limited local talent pool has resulted in the need to reach out to the Mainland for talent. Training in this BFA track will help to sideline this occurrence, and casting directors offer their full support to this proposal. (Please see letters of support attached)
 - e. Current and former students in the department also support this proposal. In exit polls conducted with graduating BA Theatre majors between spring 2015 and spring 2021, many said they would have selected a BFA in Acting had it been an option.



With curriculum modification proposal, we are fulfilling the Manoa Budget Team's mandate to consolidate our undergraduate degrees in Theatre and Dance by modifying the BFA degree in Dance to become a BFA in Theatre and Dance, with two tracks in Dance and in Acting for Theatre, Screen and New Media, so as to be parallel with the BA degree.

BACKGROUND:

The modification of degree requirements, program sheets, and four-year plans are to support curricular changes in the merger of degrees from the BA Theatre to BA Theatre and Dance, BA Dance to BA Theatre and Dance, BFA Dance to BFA Theatre and Dance. The changes help facilitate program changes recommended by the budget committee.

The faculty in the Department of Theatre and Dance have been in discussions since February of 2021 about this program merger, and have taken great pains to ensure that courses can be offered in a rotation that will satisfy the needs of the new tracks as proposed. While Theatre and Dance courses are offered on other UH campuses, we do not foresee any major impact on them.

This track is designed for students who wish to pursue professional careers as actors in theatre, television, film, and digital performance. Admission to the program is by audition only. Incoming students may declare a BA major in Theatre and Dance with a selection of the Theatre Track on their university application, then audition for the BFA degree during the spring semester of their first year at UH Manoa.
