Required courses will build proficiency in Hawaiian language and Cultural knowledge for students to establish a cultural base and language identity in which to center and ground themselves in a Hawaiian worldview to better relate to other languages and cultures around the world.

2.4) Justification or Rationale for Program Action

Along with this certificate affording an opportunity for students in other disciplines other than HPST to gain knowledge and earn valuable credentials to add to students marketability and usefulness in the job market. This program is in direct alignment with the UH Strategic Directions, 2015-2021 in which the university articulates its aspiration to be "the world's foremost indigenous serving university" and wherein the university asserts that it "embraces its unique responsibilities to the indigenous people of Hawai'i and to Hawai'i's indigenous

language and culture." The university affirms this commitment through "vigorous programs of study and support for the Hawaiian language, history and culture." In addition, the Hawai'i Papa o ke Ao Report (2012) calls for the creation and support of "Vibrant Language and Culture Programs of Study at all UH campuses."3 In addition to these documents guiding the university at the system level, the UHWO campus also has committed to the support and development of Hawaiian language in its own campus Strategic Action Plan 2018-2028 (SAP) "Strengthen commitment to 'Ōlelo Hawai'i/Hawaiian Language instruction-partnering with community colleges to expand services." A certificate in Hawaiian language will begin to build towards the goals of the institution in supporting the mission to be an indigenous serving institute in the language which identifies the Hawaiian people. UHWO SAP supports this certificate proposal. In years one to two and three to six of this SAP, three general impact strategies are listed along with tactics for execution. This certificate will expand and develop dynamic trans-disciplinary educational experiences that link learning to significant issues impacting communities (2.2)., Foster existing and new partnerships with Pre-12 schools and the UH Community Colleges to create pathways for students to matriculate into UH West O'ahu (2.3). Increase engaged scholarship and research (2.5), and create academic innovation experiences that involve community needs (2.6). This certificate will magnify campus and community relations
