3.1) Program Justification

The certificate will encourage students to get an AA degree in history or in the Arts and Humanities field. History teaches fundamental critical thinking and problem-solving, cultural understanding and sensitivity, and an essential understanding of morality and politics for those going into law and government jobs. A majority of our students go into the service industry, nursing, and travel industry and will need history to deal with the diverse groups of people they will serve and to bridge cultural barriers. We are also currently working with the Teaching Education Program directly and do have many teachers in our online and in our on-campus classes who go on to teach history. In addition, students have shown an interest in having such a degree and note that they would take more history courses if they could earn a history certificate.

3.2) Program Mission and Objectives

The certificate will be directly tied to our history SLOs. We regularly assess and discuss our SLOs. In addition, we intend to tie the certificate to study abroad programs. The certificate will be tied to a Global Studies travel scholarship as many students express great interest in studying abroad to expand their historical and cultural knowledge after taking history classes. Encouraging students to experience the wider world outside of Hawaii is another important goal and the certificate will be part of reaching that goal.
