4. Program description (for catalog):

The English Academic Subject Certificate (ASC) is designed for students who are interested in studying rhetoric and literature, beyond what is required for their current degree program. This pathway offers students an opportunity to develop advanced composition and rhetorical skills, refine critical reading and analysis skills, and explore multiple areas of literature that will help them to better understand and appreciate the diverse world around them. The program is designed for students to gain a solid grounding in English composition and literature, while affording the option of a focus on a particular literary genre or creative writing. Completion of the English ASC will allow students to satisfy the Liberal Arts AA degree's requirements for FW, DL, HAP/PC, and two WI courses, as well as a DA course if ENG 104 is opted for. The program introduces students to some of the discipline's general areas of study (genre, historical breadth, literature & culture, and composition/rhetoric) as defined in most Bachelor degree programs, including at the University of Hawai'i at Mānoa (UHM) and the University of Hawai'i at Hilo (UHH). It also serves as an introduction to UHM and UHH areas of study within their English majors, satisfying UHM's

8. Reason for this program action:

Many students in the Liberal Arts program are interested in literature studies, but once students have satisfied the FW and DL requirement for the program, further study in composition and literature is often not pursued because it is not required by their current degree program, leading to financial aid and advising conflicts. This certificate will reward students who choose to pursue challenging courses in advanced composition (ENG 200) and literary study, refining their writing, reading, and research skills. This is especially true in that all ENG literature courses are generally offered as Writing Intensive (WI), a fact that will also help students meet the 2 WI course requirement for the AA degree. With this ASC, interested students can opt to take additional literature courses to earn elective credits for their degree program while satisfying program requirements.
