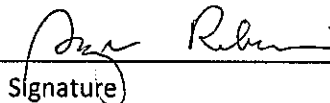

The Fitness Professional program is designed to prepare students to become certified personal trainers in the community. They will be prepared to set up personal training programs, give basic nutritional guidance, and market themselves.

Program Admission Requirements: None.

CPR certification is required before graduation.

This program will provide students on Kaua'i an avenue to pursue a Fitness Professional certificate on our island, as an independent certificate, or in addition to earning an AA degree or a BS in Kinesiology and Rehabilitative Sciences so that the graduates can find a personal trainer position on Kaua'i or elsewhere. Not all students have enough money to attend a four-year university, so this gives them a professional avenue in fitness that will provide a needed service on Kaua'i or other location.
