#### **PURPOSE**:

To stop out admission of new students for one year.

#### BACKGROUND:

In accordance with Board of Regents (BOR) Policy, RP 5.201, Instructional Programs, Section IIIE, and associated UH Executive Policy #E.5.202, Section III, F and Section IV, B, the Chancellor's approval is requested to temporarily stop out the admission of new students to the Associate in Arts in Liberal Arts degree with Concentration in Deaf Studies/Deaf Education.

The Education Program Coordinator is currently in talks with the State of Hawai'i Department of Education (DOE) Complex Superintendent to revamp the program. If the DOE decides to move forward with Deaf Studies/Deaf Education, an articulation agreement between Kapi'olani Community College and the DOE will be signed. Based on the agreement, changes will be made to the program so a one-year stop out is being requested. A decision will be forthcoming before spring 2020.

No current students in the program will be impacted by the Stop Out. Of the five students in the program, two will graduate in spring 2019. The other three have taken the requisite courses and are completing their General Education requirements. One is expected to complete the program in spring 2021, two in fall 2021. Two other students have been enrolled in the program since 2016 but have not taken any of the required courses to date. They will be advised to change their major. A third student has already been advised to change her major.

#### **ACTION RECOMMENDED:**

It is recommended that the Chancellor approve stop out admission of new students to the Associate in Arts in Liberal Arts with a Concentration in Deaf Studies/Deaf Education.
