1. SPECIFIC ACTION REQUESTED: Approval of a Concentration in Family Resources

#### Program Description:

The A.A. degree in Liberal Arts with a Concentration in Family Resources prepares students to transfer to four-year institutions. This 60-credit program satisfies all of the requirements for the A.A. degree in Liberal Arts and also provides students with solid knowledge and skills to be successful in entering a university Family Resources program. This concentration will provide students with the foundation understanding of ecological systems-based study of lifespan development and family resource management to prepare them for curriculum that "further emphasizes the study of child, adolescent, adult development; family development (such as marriage and parenting); family resource management (such as consumer and family economics and family management); community needs; and leadership in human services occupations" (Catalog UH Manoa, 2013).

### Program Learning Outcomes for the Liberal Arts Degree:

- 1. Make effective decisions with intellectual integrity to solve problems and/or achieve goals utilizing the skills of critical thinking, creative thinking, information literacy, and quantitative/symbolic reasoning.
