

**Subject:** Proposed A.A. in Liberal Arts Degree with a Concentration in Psychology

1. **SPECIFIC ACTION REQUESTED:** Approval of a Concentration in Psychology

### **Program Description:**

The A.A. Degree in Liberal Arts with a Concentration in Psychology prepares students to transfer to four-year institutions. This 60-credit program satisfies all of the requirements for the A.A. degree in Liberal Arts. Additionally, the program imparts students with solid knowledge and skills toward a Bachelor degree in Psychology. After successful completion of the program, students will have a strong understanding of the field of Psychology, and good foundational knowledge of the research methods and statistics used by psychologists, as well as a clear sense of the major perspectives, which define the field of Psychology. Targeted advising and a carefully planned course sequence enable students to successfully transfer to baccalaureate institutions in Hawai'i that have Psychology-related majors, such as the University of Hawai'i at Mānoa, University of Hawai'i Maui College, and the University of Hawai'i at Hilo.

### **Program Learning Outcomes for the Liberal Arts Degree:**

1. Make effective decisions with intellectual integrity to solve problems and/or achieve goals utilizing the skills of critical thinking, creative thinking, information literacy, and quantitative/symbolic reasoning.
2. Ethically, compose, convey, and interpret varied perspectives with respect to an intended audience using visual, oral, written, social, and other forms of communication.
3. Evaluate one's own ethics and traditions in relation to those of other peoples and embrace the diversity of human experience while actively engaging in local, regional, and global communities.
4. Through various modes of inquiry, demonstrate how aesthetics engage the human experience, revealing the interconnectedness of knowledge and life.
5. Explore and synthesize knowledge, attitudes, and skills from a variety of cultural and academic perspectives to enhance our local and global communities.

### **Student Learning Outcomes for the Concentration in Psychology:**

1. Identify the concepts, language, and major theories of the discipline to account for psychological phenomena.
  2. Compare and contrast the major perspectives of Psychology: behavioral, neuroscience, cognitive, evolutionary, humanistic, psychodynamic, and sociocultural.
  3. Apply psychological concepts, theories, and research findings as these relate to everyday life.
  4. Demonstrate knowledge of research methods, hypothesis testing, and appropriate use of statistics to assess hypothesis.
2. **RECOMMENDED EFFECTIVE DATE:** Fall 2017
3. **PURPOSE:** The purpose of the Concentration in Psychology is to create a clear, seamless pathway for students interested in transferring to a 4-year institution with a Bachelor's degree in Psychology.

4. **BACKGROUND AND CONSEQUENCES:** In February 2015, the Social Sciences Department at Kapi'olani Community College (KCC) met with the Dean and faculty of the Social Sciences at the University of Hawai'i at Manoa. This conversation led to some clarifications between our two programs, which led to the present initiative. The Concentration in Psychology is being developed to respond to the needs of students interested in a Psychology major, who would like to transfer to a four-year institution and beyond. The A.A. Degree in liberal arts with a Concentration in Psychology will allow students to declare their major upon arrival, which will help them complete their degrees in a timely fashion, as well as joining Psychology clubs like Psy Chi. The Concentration in Psychology also aligns with the Memorandum of Agreement established between Kapi'olani Community College and the University of Hawai'i at Manoa.
