The degree provides students with an understanding of a framework for second language learning and teaching, skills and strategies for second language teaching, the diversity of second language learners, legal issues and advocacy strategies to support second language learning, the diversity of second language learners, classroom management strategies, linguistic principles to support second language learning, and the importance of assessment for second language learning. The degree also provides students with numerous opportunities to discuss and research current issues and challenges in second language education, advocate for second language students and their families, and engage in a variety of service learning and field experiences working with children and adults in public and private classroom settings. Personalized advising and a carefully planned course sequence enable students to successfully transfer to baccalaureate institutions in Hawai'i that have language education-related majors, such as the University of Hawai'i at Mānoa, Second Language Studies Department and College of Education, and Hawai'i Pacific University, TESL Program.
