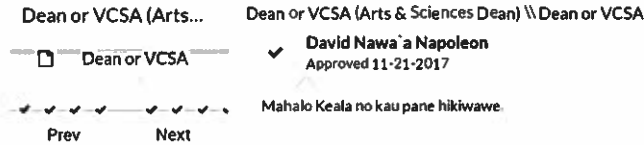

AA.2) PROPOSAL SUMMARY

To create a Concentration in Pacific Islands Studies (PACS) under the Associate in Arts degree in Liberal Arts. The PACS concentration will provide students with a strong foundation in the interdisciplinary approaches in Pacific Islands Studies while satisfying all of the requirements for the A.A. degree in Liberal Arts. Completing the PACS concentration requirements will allow students to complete the lower division core requirements for the BA in Pacific Islands Studies at UH Mānoa.

AA.3) PROPOSAL RATIONALE/JUSTIFICATION (KO KE NOI KUMU)

Interest in the Pacific Islands region and its people has increased over the last few years. The interest comes from multiple sources. First, Native Hawaiian students have taken an interest in the Pacific as the larger geographic, historical, and cultural context within which their culture exists. Second, growing Pacific Islander immigrant communities are becoming more prominent in the local community creating a need for service providers and others to understand the Islander backgrounds. Finally, second and third generation immigrant Pacific Islander students are now seeking to reconnect with their home cultures and identities. Providing an opportunity for each of these populations to learn more about the Pacific Islands and its peoples address Kapi'olani CC's and the UH System's goal to be a model indigenous-serving institution.

Furthermore, the BA in Pacific Islands Studies was established in 2010. Previously, the degree was only available as an individualized program through the Interdisciplinary Studies Program at UHM. With the advent of a formalized BA program, there is now a clear pathway to feed into for Kapi'olani Community College students.
