A.4. Justification for proposal type (and, if applicable, modifications)

Prior to Fall 2018, KAU offered PSY 220. It had no prerequisite and it articulated to UHM as HDFS 230. Beginning in Fall 2018, KAU switched to PSY 240 for system alignment. It now had PSY 100 as a prerequisite and it no longer articulated as HDFS. We have gone from offering 2 very full sections of 220 per semester to one semi-full section of 240 per semester.

This lack of transferability as HDFS 230 is impacting our Nursing and ECED students. While discussions are ongoing with UHM about reestablishing articulations, there are about 11 KAU students per semester taking HDFS other campuses and I believe we can fill the course especially if we utilize online modalities.

Offering HDFS 230 rather than PSY 240 would likely be preferred by students as it is a DS course throughout the system and students currently need six DS credits from two different disciplines for the AA. Even though our PSY 240 is DS, it doesn't really help students with Gen Ed since they need PSY 100 as a prerequisite and it's also DS.
