SUBJECT: Request for a New Banner Subject Code (COA)

SPECIFIC ACTION REQUESTED:

It is requested that the interim Vice Chancellor for Academic Affairs approve the creation of a new Banner Subject Code, "COA" for Center on Aging curriculum and offering.

RECOMMENDED EFFECTIVE DATE: August 1, 2018

ADDITIONAL COST: None

PURPOSE:

- To facilitate the development of new course offerings in the UHM Center on Aging, MBT School of Social Work
- To identify UHM aging-related courses approved as fulfilling the requirements of the Undergraduate Certificate on Aging (and eventually the Graduate Certificate on Aging).

BACKGROUND:

• Few states are aging as rapidly as Hawai'i. By 2020, approximately 25.8% of Hawai'i's residents will be 60+ years old. Members of the workforce in Hawai'i require training in aging to better serve growing numbers of older patients, clients, and consumers.

- While Hawai'i needs more geriatric health professionals and eldercare workers to address the medical and basic care needs of its aging population, it also needs workers in fields such as architecture, law, design, engineering, business, urban planning, fashion, the tourism and hospitality industry, and so on, who understand basic aging-related changes and know how to accommodate and support older adults by making their products and services age-friendly.
- In response to this need, the UHM Center on Aging recently reinstated the Undergraduate Certificate on Aging and will soon reinstate the Graduate Certificate on Aging. The intent of the Undergraduate Certificate Program is not to produce professional gerontologists (although some students may choose this option), but to integrate gerontological knowledge with that of students' respective majors, to better equip them for careers in the fields of their choice within a demographically transformed world.
- The certificate programs will take advantage of existing resources, assembling
 pre-existing courses into an organized, interdisciplinary program to address the
 current urgent community need for gerontological training as it relates to diverse
 fields.
- Essential gerontological knowledge and skills will be covered through adherence
 to the national guidelines established by the Association for Gerontology in Higher
 Education (AGHE) Standards and Guidelines for Gerontology and Geriatrics in
 Higher Education (6th edition) and Gerontology Competencies for Undergraduate
 and Graduate Education (2014). The certificates will acknowledge achievement of
 aging specialist status through a formal credential.
- Aging-related course offerings currently are scattered in departments throughout
 the UHM campus, making it difficult for students to identify courses relevant to
 the certificates and to aging in general. To facilitate development of new
 aging-related courses and identify existing courses that fulfill certificate
 requirements, we request a dedicated Banner Subject Code, "COA" (Center on
 Aging).
- The Center on Aging will develop a MOU with each department that offers courses relevant to the certificate programs. Through cross-listing with existing courses and assignment to new aging courses, the "COA" Banner Subject Code will provide a linked identity for these courses and facilitate the marketing of the certificate programs.

ACTION RECOMMENDED:

It is recommended that the interim Vice Chancellor for Academic Affairs approve the creation of "COA" as a new banner subject code for course offerings associated with the UHM Certificate Programs on Aging.
