

FMPC 491 (Senior Project) provides an opportunity for students to work with a faculty member on an original creative and/or scholarly project in the field of film, media, and popular culture studies. Students will share the results of this project via a substantial thesis-oriented paper and brief oral presentation. As such, this Writing Intensive course will require an introductory "state of the project" paper; a project proposal, and a paper (two drafts).

FMPC 491 is taught by Humanities Division faculty members whose interests and expertise align with the projects in question. These instructors are responsible for guiding the students enrolled in the course through the writing process: topic selection; thesis formulation; secondary research; drafting; evaluation of the final draft; and assistance with conclusive presentation.
