I think that there are several issues with using ISSP....

1. ISSP stands for Information Security Specialist which is actually a recognized job classification/name (like programmer or network engineer) so it is very limiting in terms of what it means in the industry.
2. There are currently no direct paths from the AS in ISSP to the BAS in ISA so having them with the same name, would seem to be inconsistent and confusing.
3. The ISA concentration is setup as a much more general degree encompassing more areas such as Policy, Forensics, Software Security, Intrusion Detection/Protection, etc....
4. ISA will hopefully become the more umbrella term within which additional specialization can be developed.
