Certificate in Educational Studies 18 Credit Hour Undergraduate Certificate Program

The Educational Studies certificate is intended to provide students with a basic understanding of the methodologies, theories, tools, and issues that shape the field of education.

The core courses in this certificate program provide students with background in educational foundations, educational technology, and developmental psychology.

The elective courses allow students to select courses from a variety of educational content areas.

Students who graduate with a certificate in Educational Studies will be prepared for a variety of education-related positions, such as coaches, educational assistants, and teachers.

Students pursuing this certificate will complete 9 credit hours (3 courses) of core courses in addition to earning 9 credit hours of electives, of which a minimum of 6 credit hours must be from the Education Department. Students must receive a grade of "C" or better in all courses applied to the certificate program.

Core Courses: Complete all core courses for a total of 9 credit hours.
