First, and most important, the public has a means by which to identify individuals who have met the minimum requirements as set forth in Hawaii Administrative Rules 11-177.1. Second, individuals are recognized for the time, education, and experience they have accumulated in the profession of alcohol and drug counseling with criminal justice clientele. Certification is meant to recognize a substance abuse counselor's accomplishments and competence in providing alcohol and drug counseling within the criminal justice system, and not as an entry-level credential.
- 2. Prerequisite: high school diploma or equivalent.
- 3. Criteria for Certified Criminal Justice Addictions Professional:
 - Experience: 6000 hours of supervised work experience specific to the domains of
 - Dynamics of addiction and criminal behavior;
 - o Legal, ethical and professional responsibility;
 - Criminal justice system and processes;
 - o Clinical evaluation: screening and assessment;
 - Treatment planning
 - o Case management, monitoring and participant supervision;
 - o Counseling
 - Documentation

An associate's degree in behavioral science may substitute for 1000 hours; a bachelor's degree in behavioral science or Certified Substance Abuse Counselor (CSAC) credential may substitute for 2000 hours; a master's degree in behavioral science or Certified Clinical Supervisor (CCS) credential may substitute for 4000 hours. Work experience must have been obtained within the 10 years prior to application.

General applications received less than 2 weeks prior to the registration deadline for an examination may not be reviewed in time to determine the applicant's eligibility for the upcoming examination. When the applicant qualifies for the written examination by virtue of documenting the education and supervised experience requirements, an examination application packet will be sent with instructions to submit the application by the established deadline for the upcoming examination cycle. If the applicant does not pass the examination, the applicant will have the opportunity to apply to retake the examination and pay the examination fee.
