Create a Certificate of Completion for Travel and Tourism

#### RECOMMENDED EFFECTIVE DATE:

Fall 2009

#### **BACKGROUND AND CONSEQUENCES:**

The major objective of the Certificate of Completion in Travel and Tourism is to prepare students with technical skills that would qualify them for entry level employment after one semester of training. Certificate of Completion programs are an excellent way to attract students to the program and acquaint them with the college and the visitor industry. A Certificate of Completion can also be an attractive short-term educational option for incumbent visitor industry employees that would like to credential their experience or enhance job skills. Students can choose to continue their education with a Certificate of Achievement or further with an Associate in Science degree.

# The program endeavors:

- to expose students to actual day-to-day travel and tourism operations.
- to acquaint students with a wide variety of equipment and technologies used in the travel industry.
- to prepare students for career planning and job placement.
- to provide a career ladder which provides career enhancement for travel and tourism employees.

The program objectives as reflected in the Hospitality and Tourism (HOST) Education Department Mission Statement below mesh with Kapi'olani Community College's Mission Statement, 2003 – 2010 as follows:
