## **Employment Objective:**

The creation of this Certificate of Competence is a vehicle to meet the objectives of a Title III grant for Native Hawaiian Serving Institutions to "create purposeful and sustainable pathways in student services, professional development and 21<sup>st</sup> century career programs for improved student learning." This Certificate of Competence addresses the objective of the grant which is: "Curriculum clusters will be developed in intercultural competence, educational tourism, eco tourism, and sports tourism to enhance the knowledge, skills and attitudes of both under-prepared and incumbent Native Hawaiian and other workers in the visitor industry. This cluster will be a vehicle for continuous job skills upgrading for both under-prepared and incumbent workers, while at the same time providing options for long term career upgrading" (KCC Grant Proposal, p. 20).

This certificate would be appropriate for incumbent workers in sustainable paths in the tourism industry or to prepare workers for various positions such as: tour guides, cultural specialists, activity coordinators, interpretive docents, nature guides, energy and environmental resource specialists. The estimated annual employment for tour guides and escorts is 2,410 (Hawai'i Workforce Informer, 2006 – 2016 Ten Year Occupational Projections, Department of Labor and Industrial Relations, State of Hawai'i).

The introduction of this Certificate of Competence provides an additional entrance point for potential students by introducing them to the college, the hospitality and tourism programs, and the visitor industry; in hopes that they will choose to continue on to other certificate or degree programs.

#### Student Learning Outcomes:

Upon successful completion of the Certificate Competence in the Principles of Sustainable Tourism, the student will be able to:

- Use knowledge of best practices to further sustainability (economic, environmental, and cultural/social) in the industry.
- Apply the concepts and skills necessary to achieve guest satisfaction.

• Demonstrate the knowledge that the foundation of tourism is based on the respect of the host culture with the responsibility to perpetuate the unique values, traditions, and practices of that place.

## **Certificate of Competence Requirements:**

The Certificate of Competence in the Principles of Sustainable Tourism is proposed to be a three (3) course, 8 credit program that could be completed in one-semester.

## **Certificate of Competence Justification:**

The Certificate of Competence in the Principles of Sustainable Tourism is a one-semester program of study. This program will provide students with an introductory overview of the principles of sustainable and responsible tourism. Students will gain the knowledge to cultivate tourism as an industry that achieves environmentally and culturally responsible economic development within a destination. The program will emphasize cultural responsibility and regard the awareness of the host culture as integral to the success of tourism. Students will gain an appreciation for the authentic interpretation of culture, language, history, historical places/people, geography and geology.

Per the World Tourism Organization (WTO) Sustainable Tourism is defined as:

"...development that meets the needs of present tourists and host regions while protecting and enhancing opportunities for the future. It is envisioned as leading to management of all resources in such a way that economic, social and aesthetic needs can be fulfilled while maintaining cultural integrity, essential ecological processes, biological diversity and life support systems"

## Course Competencies

HOST 101 – Introduction to Hospitality: provides students with an overview of the industry and the interrelationships of the need to balance the environmental, cultural and economic needs of a destination.

**HOST 168 – Tour Directing**: provides students with the appreciation of the place and host culture. Develops in the students the importance of authentic interpretation of the culture, history, geology, politics, flora and fauna of the destination.

HOST 265 – Tourism Destination Development and Planning: provides students with a deeper and broader appreciation of the importance of sustainability in the environment, the economy and the culture. Students develop an understanding of the economic impacts tourism has on a destination especially in regards to job creation and poverty alleviation. Students study a "value-based" culturally sensitive business model of management with an emphasis on perpetuating the culture of the destination the organization is operating in.
