Background Information: Leeward is creating a new **concentration** program code for the Alternative Certificate for CTE Licensure. Program requires a Baccalaureate or Associate degree for admission. The course work level is all undergraduate classes. Campus is requesting level to be **Post-Baccalaureate**. No major code was indicated by the campus.

Questions/Concerns:

1. **Are community colleges allowed to have a Post-Baccalaureate (PB) level? Note, the only campus that offers PB level is UH Hilo; and, only Hilo and Manoa offer Graduate level. And if they are, should this be considered PB since a student can be admitted with an Associate too?**
2. **Does the concentration need to be attached to a major code?**

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
